Multiple Accounts

Sharks are Killers

The ocean is full of dangerous animals, but the shark is one that all humans should be scared of. Not only do they have sharp teeth and a love for eating meat, they almost always attack humans without any reason. This spontaneous attacking makes sharks even more dangerous to people who are swimming, surfing, or just enjoying the ocean. Scientists are not able to pinpoint why sharks attack when they do, and it appears to be at random. This means that humans cannot protect themselves from shark attacks by avoiding certain areas or behaviors. To sharks, humans are just another animal to hunt, eat, and enjoy. This is bad news for people everywhere.

Sharks are Misunderstood

People are often afraid of sharks, and with good reason. With a mouth full of sharp teeth, this carnivorous creature can seem quite frightening. However, most shark attacks on humans are not random. There are many factors that can lead to a shark attacking a human. Sharks are naturally curious and this curiosity can lead to an accidental attack on a human. If a shark sees something splashing in the water, it might wonder if the splasher is a tasty seal. As the shark investigates, it can become confused or frightened when faced with a human instead of a seal. Further, even though the ocean is a big place, sharks often find themselves sharing water space with humans. If a shark is out and about to eat in the same place that humans are hanging out in the water, an attack can also occur. On average, sharks attack and kill about 10 humans per year. Humans, on the other hand, kill about 25 million sharks annually. This seems to be unfair; sharks are misunderstood creatures.
