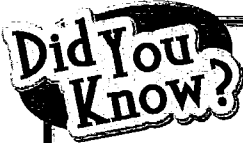

The Ancient Israelites

The ancient Israelites developed a society based on ideas of justice and strict laws. The Israelites believed there was only one God.



The Phoenicians were skilled sailors. They went on voyages of discovery and for trade. When sailing they always kept the shoreline in sight. When sailing at night, Phoenician sailors kept their ships going in the right direction by observing constellations and the North Star. In fact, the North Star in the ancient world was called the "Phoenician Star."

REVIEWING CHAPTER 3

The First Israelites

- Abraham founded 12 tribes of Israel in the land of Canaan. They lived in Canaan about 100 years.
- The Israelites believed in one God who set down moral laws for his people.
- They used the Ten Commandments as rules to live by and recorded their history in the Bible.
- Due to a long drought in Canaan, the Israelites went to Egypt to survive. They were enslaved in Egypt, but escaped.
- The Israelites had to fight the Canaanites to return to their promised land.
- Joshua and the judges, including Deborah, won back territory in central Canaan for the Israelites.

The Kingdom of Israel

- Saul was the first king of the Israelites. He united the 12 tribes into one kingdom.
- King David built an Israelite empire and made Jerusalem his capital city.

- Solomon built a great temple at Jerusalem. After he died, the Israelites split into two kingdoms—Israel and Judah.
- The Assyrians and then the Chaldeans conquered Israel and Judah, and forced many Israelites to leave their homeland.

The Growth of Judaism

- During their exile in Babylon, the Jews developed their religion, which is based upon the Hebrew Bible.
- Jews spread their ideas to the Greek world.
- In about 168 B.C., they fought the Greeks for control of Judah.
- Religious laws concerning food and clothing affected everyday Jewish life.
- In 63 B.C. the Romans conquered Judah.
- Under Roman rule, the Jews were divided and rebellious. In response, the Romans destroyed the temple in Jerusalem and exiled the Jews.
